This information is designed to prepare you for Fall Quarter enrollment.

Choosing Classes

 A typical first quarter schedule consists of three or four courses, a total of 12-16 units. Being enrolled in 12 units is considered full-time.

Here is an example:

WCWP 100 – Academic Writing	Major Course – see major department website for requirements	
General Education Course	GE or Major Course – a

- You must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units to be a full-time student.
 Most classes at UC San Diego (UCSD) are 4.0 quarter units.
- You must complete at least 36 units in each academic year to comply with the minimum progress regulation.
- If you are working 20 or more hours per week, you may want to consider filing for <u>Part-Time status</u>.

The Quarter System

- There are three quarters in an academic year at UCSD:
 Fall, Winter, and Spring, with optional Summer Session(s)
- A quarter is 10 weeks with final exams Week 11.
- Midterm exams may begin as early as Week 3.
- The quarter system moves quickly, stay prepared and do not fall behind.

Transfer Programs

- IGETC: send official IGETC certification to UCSD Admissions Office as soon as possible (deadline was early July)
- * Partial IGETC: send Partial IGETC certification to UCSD Admissions as soon as possible (deadline was early July) and speak with a Warren College counselor to determine additional coursework.
- UC or 4-Year Reciprocity: submit official letter to Warren College academic advising
- * Other: See Warren advisor

Transfer Student General Education Requirements

With completed IGETC/UC/4-Year Reciprocity/Verified Transfer Program:

- WCWP 100: Academic Writing
- Breadth Requirement: Two fourunit upper-division courses, noncontiguous to the major discipline

Without Completion of a Verified Transfer Program:

- Warren College <u>standard GE</u> requirements
- WCWP 100 (in lieu of WCWP 10A and 10B)
- Transfer coursework may satisfy some GE requirements

Placement Exams

Math Placement Exam (MPE): If not met, it is needed to determine proper placement in pre-calculus coursework or an introductory calculus courses at UCSD.

Planning Your Schedule

- You can complete a Course Enrollment Plan on WebReg. Your planned courses are not official until you are enrolled.
- To plan a course on WebReg, type the course name in the Search for Classes bar at the top left of the webpage. Select the course you wish to plan and click the "plan" button. The course will be listed on your plan.
- To officially enroll in the course during your enrollment time, click the "enroll" button for the course.
- When planning your schedule, consider co-curricular activities to maintain a balance with your academic schedule.



Preparing for Academic Success

- Your actual study time will depend on the material being covered, your familiarity with the material, and your study skills. A good rule of thumb: spend three hours outside of class for every hour spent in lecture.
- For a typical 4.0 unit class (three hours of lecture), you will study about nine hours per week.

Friday of Week 6	Deadline to drop a class with a W (Withdrawal) on the transcript
